According to the new moon Hebrew calendar that God has ordained in the scriptures, February 20 (Friday) the new moon was sighted in Jerusalem, Israel and Adar 1st began at sunset, making today the new moon day and the beginning of the 12th Hebrew month. There will be an article in the next Prophecy Flash on the new moon and potential visibility which I spoke about a few weeks ago. As you know, we go by the sighting of the new moon in Jerusalem, Israel. This is because today we have instant communication around the globe by the Inter-Net, and cannot take refuge in the idea that we are an isolated community where everyone has to view the new moon for themselves where they live and must go by their own reckoning and viewing. If we did, we would have great confusion. God is not the author of confusion—but the author of peace, unity and oneness. Satan the devil IS the author of confusion. When we have one sighting of the new moons in Jerusalem, the headquarters where God placed his temple and where the Messiah will reign when he returns, then we have unity with everyone following the same calendar. This is the way it ought to be. Then we all keep the same holy days at the same appointed times and defer to God's government and not just what seems right in our own eyes with everyone confused and dazed.

Now that we are living in the end-time and we know that we are living in the end-time, it means that we are responsible for preparing for the coming of Messiah. There is a lot that we need to do in order to be ready.

I have been reading “[A Rabbi Looks at the Last Days](#) by Jonathan Bernis, a Messianic Rabbi who has a lot of good strong comments of how he became a Christian even though he was a Jew and grew up in a traditional Jewish home. He points out that all over the world Jewish people are coming to faith in Yeshua. Their eyes are being opened as **Romans 11** foretold would happen. There are more Jews believing in Christ today in numbers not seen since the first century when

there were thousands in Jerusalem (book of Acts). Today, there are over six million Jews living in the land of Israel. There are at least 5,700,000 million Jews (2014) in the U.S. with at least one million acknowledging Christ positively as a divinely inspired teacher or prophet. Worldwide Jewish population at the end of 2014 according to *The Jewish Virtual Library* is 13,900,000. The fact that Jews are returning to Jerusalem in droves today is one of the great outstanding prophecies fulfilled that would occur in the last days at the end of time in which we are living today. God said that in the end-times the coastlands of Israel would once again be inhabited by his people. Once again since 1948 Judah is living in Israel.

People say, to Rabbi Jonathan, ‘You make it sound easy to reach Jews with the Gospel, but it is not.’ Rabbi Jonathan lived not only with Jewish parents but in a Jewish community that had an “ingrown mentality of us and them—we were Jews, and anyone who wasn’t Jewish was a Gentile or Christian — which were synonymous. You can imagine my parents shock and pain when I told them I had accepted Jesus Christ.” It takes a special sensitivity and depth of understanding when talking to a Jewish person about Jesus, because it is hard for them to see how a Jew can realize that it is possible to believe in Yeshua and remain a Jew given the teaching from childhood that Christians blamed Jews for killing Jesus, their God. Jews have experienced over two thousand years of persecution at the hands of those who called themselves Christian.

“My friend Sid Roth, host of the television program *It’s Supernatural*, told me a story that illustrates this point. It grieved Sid that his widowed father did not want to hear anything about Yeshua and, in fact, forbade his son to bring a New Testament into his home. Sid thought long and hard about how to overcome his dad’s resistance. Finally, inspiration hit. While attending his father’s synagogue one day, he bought a kosher Jewish Publication Society version of the Hebrew Scriptures—a Jewish version of the *Old Testament*. He then asked the rabbi to sign it for him. That night he gave the Bible to his father as a gift. Then as they were sitting together, Sid said, ‘Dad I want to read you something.’ He turned to Isaiah 53 (in the *Tanakh*) and read the entire chapter. When he finished, the old man’s face reddened, and he said angrily, ‘I told you never to bring a New Testament into my home.’ Then Sid protested, ‘This is **Isaiah 53** from our own Scriptures’ and showed his father that he had been reading from a kosher Bible signed by his rabbi. After sitting for a moment or two, looking at the rabbi’s signature his dad stated, ‘I never trusted that rabbi.’ ”

Turn to **Isaiah 53** and read the prophecies which are all about Christ’s coming to earth, his healing ministry of service while on earth and the giving of himself (his life) a sacrifice for all mankind which made salvation possible. This was written 950 years before Christ was even born. Jews do not commonly refer to the Hebrew Bible as the *Old Testament* which is a Christian usage. The *Tanakh* is an acronym for the three categories of books that make up the Hebrew Bible: **Torah** (first five books [Law], **Nevi’im** (Prophets), and **Ketuvim** (Writings).

Even though we are living in an age of betrayal, we do not need to be fearful and afraid. We do need to place our faith in God and keep our eyes on Christ. **Matthew 14:22-33**—the disciples were in a boat at night in the middle of the sea, tossed by the waves, for the wind was contrary. They cried out when they saw Jesus walking on the water toward them. Immediately Jesus spoke to them, saying, “Be of good cheer! It is I; do not

be afraid.” Peter called out, “Lord, if it is you, command me to come to you on the water.” Jesus said, “Come.” And when Peter had come down out of the boat, he walked on the water to go to Jesus. But when he saw that the wind was boisterous, he was afraid (he took his eyes off Christ); and beginning to sink he cried out, saying, “**Lord, save me!**” And immediately Jesus stretched out His hand and caught him, and said to him, “O you of little faith, why did you doubt?” When they got into the boat, the wind ceased. Then those who were in the boat came and worshiped Him, saying, “Truly you are the Son of God.”

The disciples were astonished! God is able to perform miracles. Christ is alive today and sits at the right hand of the Father in heaven today. Even though we on earth know great tribulation is coming upon the earth in our time, we do not need to be fearful and timid. This means keeping your eyes on Christ and do not take your eyes off of Christ or you will sink. Whatever miracle you need God will perform it for you if you keep your eyes focused on him. When enemies and foes were attacking David, his declaration of faith in God is found in **Psalms 27:1**—“The Lord is my light and my salvation. Whom shall I fear? The LORD is the strength of my life, of whom shall I be afraid? When the wicked came against me, though an army may encamp against me, my heart shall not fear. Though war may rise against me, in this I will be confident. In the time of trouble he shall hide me in His pavilion. In the secret place of His tabernacle he shall hide me; he shall set me high upon a rock.”

Be content and thankful with what you have, and do not worry about what you do not have. **Hebrews 13:5**—“Let your conduct be without covetousness; be content with such things as you have. For He Himself has said, ‘**I will never leave you nor forsake you.**’ ” So we may boldly say: ‘*The LORD is my helper; I will not fear. What can man do to me?*’ ” This is said to you and me, brother and sister. This week, on Shoebat.com, I saw the propaganda video released Sunday by ISIS: 21 captive members of Egypt's Coptic Christian minority on a Libyan beach all are dressed in orange jumpsuits with their hands cuffed behind them with jihadists in black standing behind each of the victims. The five-minute video, released by the terror group's propaganda wing al-Hayat Media, includes a masked English-speaking jihadist who says, “The sea you have hidden Sheikh Osama bin Laden's body in, we swear to Allah, we will mix it with your blood.” Then on cue, all the victims were pushed to the ground and beheaded. I consider every one of these victims executed, as my brothers in Christ. What they did know about Christ, they believed in and gave their lives for Him. God is not a “respector” of persons.

John 4:17-24—Jesus said to the Samaritan woman at the well, “You have well said, ‘I have no husband,’ for you have had five husbands, and the one whom you now have is not your husband; in that you spoke truly.” The woman said to Him, “Sir, I perceive that you are a prophet. Our fathers worshiped on this mountain and you Jews say that in Jerusalem is the place where one ought to worship.” Christ replied, “Woman, believe me, the hour is coming when you will neither on this mountain, nor in Jerusalem, worship the Father. You worship what you do not know; we know what we worship, for **salvation is of the Jews**. But the hour is coming, and now is, when the true worshipers will worship the Father *in SPIRIT AND TRUTH*; for the Father is **seeking** such to worship Him. **God is Spirit and those who worship Him must worship in spirit and truth.**” The Holy Spirit given to those who love God is one of righteousness and peace and joy—NOT the spirit of forced conversion and beheading. This is spirit of Satan the

devil, not God but the modern spirit of Molech the pagan fire god of human sacrifices worshiped by the Canaanites. It is an abomination in the sight of YHVH—God the Father of the Universe.

These are the words of God and I am sharing them with you. **John 17:17**—“Your word is truth.” **John 10:35**—“the Scripture cannot be broken.” The Koran is a counterfeit.

We need to get right with God, brethren. If we do not get right with God, then it does not matter if we die in martyrdom, because we do not have a future. **Luke 13:1-5** —“There were present at that season some who told Him about the Galileans whose blood Pilate had mingled with their sacrifices. And Jesus answered and said to them, ‘Do you suppose that these Galileans were worse sinners than all other Galileans, because they suffered such things? I tell you, no; but unless you repent you will all likewise perish. Or those eighteen on whom the tower in Siloam fell and killed them, do you think that they were worse sinners than all other men who dwelt in Jerusalem? I tell you, no; but **unless you repent you will all likewise perish.**’ ” We are not to fear men, but fear God— honor him and he will remove your other fears.

Psalm 118:5-10—“I called on the LORD in distress; The Lord answered me and set me in a broad place. The Lord is on my side; I will not fear. What can man do to me? The Lord is for me among those who help me. Therefore I shall see my desire on those who hate me. It is better to trust in the Lord than to put confidence in man. It is better to trust in the Lord than to put confidence in princes. All nations surrounded me, but in the name of the Lord I will destroy them.” Men can kill your physical body, but they can’t kill your soul/spirit. They can’t kill your eternal life, or cast you into Ghenna fire. But God can and will do that to all those who do not obey and fear him. **Matthew 10:28**—“Do not fear those who kill the body but cannot kill the soul. But rather fear Him who is able to destroy both soul and body in hell.” **Psalm 118:16-18**—“The right hand of the LORD is exalted; the right hand of the Lord does valiantly. I shall not die, but live and declare the works of the Lord. The the Lord has chastened me severely, but he has not given me over to death.”

Christ has called us out of this world to be his witnesses in this end time to the glory of God, Messiah-ship of Christ and the coming kingdom of God, and to give the world hope. That is a job we have to do. Rabbi Jonathan Bernis gives five helpful ways to endure and to fulfill our destinies until Christ’s return in our daily Christian role. Chapter 12, pages 223-225. He wrote, “I used to think how great it would have been to have lived during the time of Jesus—to have watched Him perform all those miracles and teach those powerful messages. But the more I understand the day, in which we live, the more grateful I am that I was born at this time, in this season. Each day we draw one day closer to the return of the Messiah to the earth.” What then should we then do, until that time arrives? How should we live?

1. Live like there is no tomorrow.

“Do you ever get out of bed in the morning and think; *this could be my last day on earth?* We need to live that way, as though that this is the last day of our lives.” Live today as though this was the last day of your life. If this really was the last day of your life, then what will you do? I would hope that you would pray to God and give thanks to

him and use every moment you have to pray for the salvation of God's people everywhere around the world who are being persecuted. God wants us to understand the mysteries he is revealing in this set time in history. He wants us to live in expectation: always watching, always waiting with anticipation—preparing for the coming of the Messiah.

Paul says in **Ephesians 5:15-17**—“See then that you walk circumspectly, not as fools but as wise; redeeming the time because the days are evil. Therefore do not be unwise, but understand what the will of the Lord is.”

Ephesians 5:11-12—“Have no fellowship with the unfruitful works of darkness, but rather expose them. For, it is shameful to even speak of those things which are done by them in secret.” You expose them by your acts in life and in your manner by not joining them in their excess and unfruitful works. Do the work of God in your life. Concentrate and dedicate everything you do to the glory and service of God the Father whatever you do. **Ephesians 5:13-18**—“But all things that are exposed are made manifest by the the light, for whatever makes manifest is light. Therefore, see then that you walk circumspectly, not as fools but as wise, redeeming the time, because the days are evil. Awake, you who sleep arise from the dead, and Christ will give you light. And do not be drunk with wine, in which is dissipation; but **be filled with the Spirit.**” Brethren, this is a command to be filled with the Spirit.

How do we be filled with God's Holy Spirit? ASK for it in prayer. **Matthew 7:7-12** and **Luke 11:9-10** — Christ said, “**ASK**, and it will be given to you; **SEEK**, and you will find; **KNOCK**, and it will be opened to you. Everyone who asks receives, and he who seeks finds, and to him who knocks it will be opened.” Let's ask for the help we need and for the Spirit of God to fill us daily!

2. Be vigilant: Watch and pray.

1 Chronicles 12:22-32—“For at that time they came to David day by day to help him, equipped for war. Captains of thousands from *Manasseh* came to David at Hebron to turn over the kingdom of Saul to him, according to the word of the LORD until it was a great army, like the army of God. At that time and place, the sons of Issachar who had understanding of the times, to know what Israel ought to do, their chiefs were two hundred; and all their brethren were at their command.” We have understanding of the times in which we live. It is incumbent to use that understanding and be zealous to do the work of God. We are the Israel of God. If you are married, you are to take care of your wife and family, or if you are a wife, you are to take care of your husband and your family and to be a light to your neighbors (love your neighbor). Do your part in God's work of witnessing to others.

1 Chronicles 28:9—“Know the God of your fathers, and serve Him with a loyal heart and with a willing mind; for the LORD searches all hearts and understands all the intent of the thoughts. If you seek Him, He will be found by you; but if you forsake Him, He will cast you off forever.” We are fighting for eternal stakes for eternal life and must not ever forsake God. If we dare forsake God and his covenant, then we disgrace ourselves and are fit only to be cast into the lake of fire as refuse. If we seek God with all of our heart, he will strengthen us and give us his Spirit, greater understanding, and work with us, through us, and in us to fulfill his word and His witness

to this world. David's final instruction to Solomon is written in verse **10**—"Consider now, for the LORD has chosen you to build a house for the sanctuary; be strong, and do it." Brethren we are building a house today. We are building the end-time house of God, the spiritual house of God—the church. One by one we are a laborer in building the house of God. He has chosen us to do it, so be strong and do the work.

Luke 2:41- 49—Jesus' parents went to Jerusalem every year at the Feast of the Passover. And when He was twelve years old, they went up to Jerusalem according to the custom of the feast. When they had finished the days, as they returned, the boy Jesus lingered behind in Jerusalem. And Joseph and His mother did not know it; but supposing Him to have been in the company, they went a day's journey, and sought Him among their relatives and acquaintances. When they did not find Him, they returned to Jerusalem, seeking Him. After three days they found Him in the temple, sitting in the midst of the teachers, both listening to them and asking them questions. All who heard Him were astonished at his understanding and answers. So when they saw Him, they were amazed. His mother said, "Son, why have you done this to us? Look, your father and I have sought you anxiously." He answered: "Why did you seek me? Did you not know that I must be about my Father's business?" We too, have to be about our Father's business, nothing else is as important.

2 Chronicles 14:2, 11-2—King Asa did what was good and right in the eyes of the LORD his God and the land was at peace. Then Zerah the Ethiopian with a host of a million with 300 chariots came against him. Asa cried out in prayer to the Lord his God: "LORD, it is nothing for you to help, whether with many or with those who have no power; help us, O LORD our God, for we rest on you, and in your name we go against this multitude. O LORD, you are our God; do not let man prevail against you!" So the Lord smote the Ethiopians and they were destroyed before the Lord and his hosts.

2 Chronicles 15:1-7 —At this point, "The Spirit of the Lord came upon the prophet Azariah and he went out to meet King Asa. He warned Asa, all Judah and Benjamin saying: 'The Lord is with you while you are with Him. *If you seek Him, He will be found by you; but if you forsake Him, He will forsake you.* For a long time Israel had been without the true God, without a teaching priest, and without law; but when in their trouble they turned to the LORD God of Israel, and sought Him, He was found by them. And in those times there was no peace to the one who went out, or to the one who came in, but great turmoil was on all the inhabitants of the lands. So nation was destroyed by nation, and city by city, for God troubled them with every adversity. But you, be strong and do not let your hands be weak, for your work shall be rewarded!' "

Verses 9-15—When Asa heard the prophecy, "he took courage and removed the abominable idols from all the land he ruled, restored the altar of the Lord before the vestibule of the Lord and gathered all Judah, Benjamin and all that dwelt with them at Jerusalem. Then they entered into a covenant to seek the LORD God of their fathers with all their heart and with all their soul; and whoever would not seek the LORD God of Israel was to be put to death, whether small or great, whether man or woman. Then they took an oath before the LORD with a loud voice, with shouting and trumpets and rams' horns (shofars). And all Judah rejoiced at the oath, for they had sworn with all their heart and sought Him with all their soul; and He was found by them, and the LORD gave them rest all around."

If you seek God, you will find him. If you forsake God, he will forsake you. God is in the process of forsaking Britain, Europe and America because of forsaking Him and they will be destroyed if they do not seek God. America has chosen a president who is lawless and an undercover Marxist sympathizer. He is a Muslim, not a Christian, who was brought up as a Muslim by his mother father and stepfather and schooled in Islam in Indonesia during his elementary years, groomed in Hawaii by Frank Marshall a Communist. America has been infiltrated by Muslims who are throughout America and the White House administration. We are about to be taken over from within. Those who do see the danger are speaking out to a country that is asleep. God's word has been removed from our schools and institutions of higher learning, Darwin's evolution is believed, thousands of unborn babies are being murdered each year, our borders have become even more open and insecure since 2008 and our President embraces the Muslim Brotherhood. 3. Occupy until Christ comes

Luke 19:12-27—because Jesus was near Jerusalem and because he realized that his disciples and those hearing him thought the kingdom of God would appear immediately, “he spoke a parable about a certain nobleman who went into a far country to receive for himself a kingdom and to return. So he called ten of his servants, delivered to them ten pounds (each pound or mina is worth about three months wages) and said to them, ‘Do business till I come.’ But his citizens hated him, and sent a delegation after him, saying, ‘We will not have this man to reign over us.’ And so it was that when he returned, having received the kingdom, he then commanded these servants, to whom he had given the money, to be called to him, that he might know how much every man had gained by trading. Then came the first, saying, ‘Master, your pound has earned ten pounds.’ And he said to him, ‘Well done, good servant; because you were faithful in a very little, have authority over ten cities.’ And the second came, saying, ‘Master, your pound has earned five pounds.’ Likewise he said to him, ‘You will also be over five cities.’ ”

“Then another came, saying, ‘Master, here is your pound, which I have kept put away in a handkerchief. I feared you, because you are an austere man. You collect what you did not deposit, and reap what you did not sow.’ He said to him, ‘Out of your own mouth I will judge you, you wicked servant. You knew that I was an austere man, collecting what I did not deposit and reaping what I did not sow. Why then did you not put my money in the bank, that at my coming I might have collected it with interest?’ And he said to those who stood by, ‘Take the pound from him, and give it to him who has ten pounds.’ (But they said to him, ‘Master, he has ten pounds.’) ‘For I say to you, that to everyone who has will be given; and from him who does not have, even what he has will be taken away from him. But bring here those enemies of mine, who did not want me to reign over them, and slay them before me.’ ”

Christ is the nobleman, and we are his servants. He has given us talents/gifts to use in serving him faithfully in obedience, faith and doing his work. We are going to be judged by our works which goes hand in hand with belief. Work while it is still day, before the night time comes.

John 9:4-5—“I must work the works of him that sent me, while it is day: the night comes, when no man can work.” As Jesus passed by he saw a man who was blind from birth. The disciples asked who did sin, this man or his parents. Why was he was born blind? Jesus answered, “Neither this man nor his parents sinned, but that the works of God should be revealed in him. I must work the works of Him who sent me while it is day; the **night is coming when no one can work**. As long as I am in the world, I am the light of the world.” Jesus spat on the ground and made clay with the saliva, and anointed the eyes of the blind man with it, and told the man to go wash in the pool of Siloam. He went and washed, and came back seeing, having received his sight.

Amos 8:11-12—“Behold, the days are coming,” says the Lord GOD, “That I will send a famine on the land, not a famine of bread, nor a thirst for water, but of hearing the words of the Lord. They shall wander from sea to sea and from north to east. They shall run to and fro, seeking the word of the LORD, but shall not find it.” The time will come when the word of the Lord will not be available and it will be too late for those who have not freely sought and learned His word.

4. Let your light shine.

Matthew 5:14-16—“You are the light of the world. A city that is set on a hill cannot be hidden. Nor do they light a lamp and put it under a basket, but on a lamp stand, and it gives light to all who are in the house. Let your light so shine before men, that they may **see** your good works and glorify your Father in heaven.” How do we glorify God? By bringing forth good fruit (fruit of God’s Spirit) in our lives—“love, joy, peace, longsuffering, kindness, goodness, faithfulness, gentleness, self-control.” Walk close to God, putting a smile in your eyes and on your face as you go about your work so that others will see your hope and expectation. It will draw others to find out what you have that they desire.

Philippians 2:14-15—“Do all things without complaining and disputing, that you may become blameless and harmless, children of God without fault in the midst of a crooked and perverse generation, among whom you shine as lights in the world, holding fast the word of life.” Get rid of complaining and criticizing. As the world gets darker with the forces of Satan, God’s people are to grow brighter and brighter. It is time to trim the wick in your lamp, make sure it is filled with the oil of the Spirit and let your light shine brightly wherever you may be. Are you on fire for God?

5. Do not worry about what is to come.

Jonathan Bernis says, “You may be worried about what is ahead. Will we experience economic collapse? What will happen to our loved ones who are not yet saved nor converted? I understand this concern as I am still praying for the majority of my family who are not yet believers in their Messiah. The decisions we make in this life determine where we spend eternity, and it is devastating to think that people we love may miss out on the joys that lie ahead for those who love God. Yet God calls us to take no thought about tomorrow but to be about the Father’s business today.” Leave the calling of each individual with God and have a ready answer for your hope and joy, do good works, the rest is in God’s hands.

Psalm 55:22—“Roll (give) your burdens upon the Lord and he will sustain you.”

Matthew 6:33-34—“But seek first the kingdom of God and His righteousness, and all these things shall be added to you. do not worry about tomorrow, for tomorrow will worry about its own things. Sufficient for the day is its own trouble.”

Matthew 6:1-14—“Take heed that you do not do your charitable deeds before men, to be seen by them. Otherwise you have no reward from your Father in heaven. When you do a charitable deed, do not let your left hand know what your right hand is doing, that your charitable deed may be in secret; and your Father who sees in secret will Himself reward you openly. When you pray, do not be like the hypocrites, for they love to pray standing in the synagogues and on the street corners to be seen by others. Truly I tell you, they have received their reward in full. But when you pray, go into your room, close the door and pray to your Father, who is unseen. Then your Father, who sees what is done in secret, will reward you. And when you pray, do not keep on babbling like pagans, for they think they will be heard because of their many words. Do not be like them, for your Father knows what you need before you ask him.” Pray the Lord’s Prayer, “Our Father in heaven, Hallowed be your name. Thy kingdom come, Thy will be done on earth as it is in heaven. Give us this day our daily bread. Forgive us our debts, as we forgive our debtors. Do not lead us into temptation, but deliver us from the evil. For thine is the kingdom and the power and the glory forever. Amen.”

“For if you forgive other people when they sin against you, your heavenly Father will also forgive you. But if you do not forgive others their sins, your Father will not forgive your sins.”

Pray for the forgiveness and correction of your sins, for your daily needs and to be safely led from temptations, snares and trials that you may face. Ask Him to guide, guard, direct and protect His people and pray for the salvation of mankind. Give God praise, thanks and the glory for all things.

Mathew 6:24, 31-32—“No man can serve two masters: for either he will hate the one, and love the other; or else he will hold to the one, and despise the other. Ye cannot serve God and mammon.”

“Therefore take no thought, saying, what shall we eat? or, What shall we drink? or, Wherewithal shall we be clothed? (For after all these things do the Gentiles seek:) for your heavenly Father knows that ye have need of all these things.” But, “seek first the kingdom of God, and his righteousness; and all these things shall be added unto you.”

Daniel 11:32-35—“the people that do know their God shall be strong, and do exploits. Some of them of understanding shall fall, to try them, and to purge, and to make them white, even to the time of the end: because it is yet for a time appointed.”

Mark 16:14-20—“Christ appeared unto the eleven as they sat at meat, and upbraided them with their *unbelief and hardness of heart*, because they believed not them which had seen him after he was risen. And he said unto them, ‘Go ye into all the world, and preach the gospel to every creature. He that believeth and is baptized shall be saved; but he that believeth not shall be damned. And these signs shall follow them that believe; In my name shall they cast out devils; they shall speak with new tongues; They shall take up serpents; and if they drink any deadly

thing, it shall not hurt them; they shall lay hands on the sick, and they shall recover.' So then after the Lord had spoken unto them, he was received up into heaven, and sat on the right hand of God. And they went forth, and preached everywhere, the Lord working with them, and confirming the word with signs following."

Miracles are going to happen!
